The Need for a Living Faith

In a jail there was a murderer sentenced to death, awaiting execution. The priest was trying to comfort him when the condemned man spoke up: "Father, instead of teaching me catechism in school, if they had taught me the penal code, I wouldn't be in the death house today." "I assure you," said the priest, "that if you had recalled what the catechism taught, you would not be in jail. Do you know what God's commandments are?" "Yes, sir." "Well?" "First, Love God above all things. Second....and the fifth - Thou shalt not lie." He said. The fifth is, 'Thou shalt not kill,'" said the priest. "You see, everything is in the catechism." *and those who know and practice it do not fear jails, prisons or death houses."*

We are reminded this week to be convinced of the importance of our faith, especially when we are faced with uncertainties. Perhaps we reflect on the figures of Abraham and Sarah as examples of what it means to live according to God's will. Their faith was so genuine and sincere that they could leave the security of their home and go to a land God would show them. Although Sarah was beyond the age of having children, they had faith in God's pledge that she would give birth to a child, and she did. Abraham was even prepared to sacrifice his son as attest of his faith. According to Hebrews, he was confident that God could bring his child back to life so that the promise of descendants would be fulfilled. With coming of Jesus among us, faith takes on a new dimension. Jesus reveals God to us in and through the flesh and blood of a living person. Faith in Jesus, give us a personal relationship with God. His words to us are important because they help us realise that everything we are and do is bound up with the life of heaven. When he tells his disciples to be ready, to keep awake, he is calling them to live each day in faithfulness, attentive to his promise to return in glory.
