19th Sunday Year B

Readings: 1 Kings:19: 4-8; Ps. 33; Eph. 4:30-5:2; Jn. 6:41-51 Meal for the Hungry.

Malnutrition is one of the main killers of our time. Grim, frightening statistics prove it. But there is another form of malnutrition, more pervasive and even more destructive than the physical one: the malnutrition of the spirit. Various factors are responsible for this. Denial of freedom of expression and lack of freedom of religion are some of the prevalent ones at the present time.

Jesus insists: God is our provident Father in heaven, so he provides bread from heaven. "The Bread of God is that which comes down from heaven" (Jn 6:32-33). Jesus was preparing the Jews to reveal himself to them as the promised Messiah. Earlier on, He had multiplied the bread and fed the hungry. He tells them to seek food that does not perish. He enlightened them that it was their Father in heaven, not Moses, who provided the manna their forefathers had eaten. Also, the manna and the loaves he multiplied were only shadowy figures of something greater and better to come. The true bread, Jesus told them, that satisfies man is the bread that is provided by heavenly Father and brings him immortality. The Jews then ask for this bread. They still look for material bread to satisfy their physical hunger. Jesus speaks about spiritual food that satisfies man's spiritual hunger. What is this solemn proclamation: "I am the Bread of Life." This is fulfilment, clarification, substance. This "I AM" is the word of God. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and Word was Godand the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth" (Jn 1:1,14). This Word of God came and dwelt among us. "One does not live on bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Mt4:4). Jesus of Nazareth is the Word of God and true bread from heaven, which the Father gives, the bread that gives life to the world. Jesus affirms: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever".

Today, we are invited to focus our attention on the nature of the Eucharistic community. A Eucharistic community before providing a meal, is a meal itself. It satisfies, or better, can or should satisfy one of the basic hungers of the human spirit: the hunger for fellowship. In fact, depending on the quality and solidarity of its being a fraternal fellowship community, a eucharistic community provides nourishment. This fellowship is brought about and nourished by the Word of God and the Body of Christ. Because the Eucharist is the Body of Christ, and the Body of Christ, to a certain extent, is the fellowship of all believers in Christ. It is not by accident that the Mass has been called the meal of the Christian community. In the first part of the Mass, the liturgy of the Word, the Christian is offered the teaching bread of Jesus present in the Scripture readings, especially the Gospel. And this bread of the Gospel must be eaten, assimilated into the very fibre of the Christian. Then, in the liturgy of the Eucharist, the Christian is offered the Body and Blood of the Lord, the food that leads him/her to life eternal, the bread of life.

The Eucharistic community, therefore, satisfies our hunger for truth, for justice, for peace. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. He is our righteousness and our peace. The Eucharistic assembly satisfies our need for love, communion and fellowship. Gathered by and in the love of Christ, in memory of Christ who loved us and asked us to love one another as he loved us, the Eucharistic assembly knits us into one community. It is the agape – love communion, meal for the hungry.
