### 32nd Sunday Year B

**Readings:** 1 Kings 17:10-16; Ps. 145; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44 **Beauty in Action!** 

There is a legend of a saint whose wonderful deeds astonished the angels, who came to learn the secret of his piety. Everywhere the saint went he diffused virtue as the flowers give out perfume, without being aware of it. The angels asked that he should be given the gift of miracles, and God consented. They asked the man if he would like, by the touch of his hand, to heal the sick. "No," he replied, "I would rather let God do it." Then would you like to convert sinners and bring them back to the right path? "No; it is the Spirit's mission to convert; I only pray." Was his reply. "Would you like to be a model of patience and draw men by piety?" "No, if men are attracted to me, they might be estranged from God." What do you desire? He said, "That God would give me his grace to do a great deal of good without knowing it." The angels were perplexed. Finally, they resolved that whenever the shadow of the man should fall where he could not see it, the shadow could cure and comfort sorrow.

The gesture of the woman in the gospel is one of the loveliest and most touching scenes in the whole of the Bible. Here comes a woman, a poor widow. Insignificant in herself, she is lost in the big crowd. Her situation is more pathetic as she is nothing among many rich and pompous people keen on making a show of themselves, bent on exhibiting their wealth, eager to practise their virtues in public. In clear contrast to all, she comes along and gently drops in two coins. A miserable mite! But someone with a better yardstick of values as Jesus declared: "Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all the others ...?" What makes her small contribution so great? It is the heart that makes all the difference. The rich who gave fat contributions did not really give up anything, as all their gifts were superfluous and with strings attached according to the gospel. This woman gave up really all that she had with no strings. Her heart was in her gift.

In a generous gift, cheerfully given, a person reveals his/her superiority over the material clay from which we are all formed. In a free gift, our spirit asserts its freedom from matter; the spirit is neither suppressed under nor shackled by the weight of the matter. In a free gift the soul smiles radiantly. Look at this woman with wrinkled skin over a worn-out frame, materially of little value and weight. And watch the affluent crowd who vie with one another to parade their pride in the temple! True worship is in spirit and in truth. what an irony! The spirit in them is crushed, crabbed and caged. They are walking corpses; how they worship in spirit and truth? On the other hands, this woman is a triumph and temple of the spirit. While her body fasts, her spirit feasts. Her small contribution is a beautiful act of religion, an act of prayer, prayer of petition, thanksgiving, praise and adoration. This is a concrete expression of her faith, hope and love. She is the living illustration of the first beatitude. Only the poor can receive the good news and only they will be happy.

Every gift is a self-gift, in it, the spirit of man/woman reaches out to another in love to share and care. Of all the gifts, the best gift is self-gift to God, the highest expression of religion and morality, liturgy and worship. The eucharist is self-gift: from God to us, and back to God, man to man and to all creation. We are rich only through what we give, and poor only through what we refuse to

give
