Second Sunday of Advent Year C

Readings: Baruch 5:1-9; Ps.126; Philippians 1:3-6,8-11; Lk. 3:1-6

The Joy of Salvation!

If there is no joy of being a Christian, probably my Christianity is leaking somewhere. This joy has its spring deep down inside, and that spring is Christ. Yes, pleasure is in our power, joy is not. "God, who is leading Israel in joy" does so "by the light of his glory" (Bar 5:9), which is Jesus Christ. Anyone who comes in touch with Christ experiences this joy. Mother St Teresa tells us of a young Maltese girl who joined her Order. On the first day she was sent to the home for the dying. When she came down, she was radiant. Mother Teresa asked why she was so happy. The girl said, "Mother, I have held Christ in my hands for three hours."

We are waiting during Advent for the coming of this Christ. Of course, Christ cannot come back in the way Serena Williams might stage a comeback, for Christ has been never away. He is always with us as he himself said. Hence, what we are waiting for is that Christ may reveal himself and make his presence felt in a new way giving us an intense experience of the joy salvation.

However, the joy of salvation does not come to us by flashing a magic wand or pressing a Christmas button. Salvation is free, yes, but it is not cheap. We have to work for it, breaking the chains we have bound ourselves with. St John the Baptist was right in repeating Isaiah's call "to make ready the way of the Lord and clear him a straight path" (Lk 3:4). The least we could do at Advent is not to put any spiritual obstacle in the way of the Lord's coming.

The joy of salvation is not the private property of any Christian; in fact, the full value of joy is in dividing it with someone. Besides, it is not right for anyone to consume joy without producing it. Hence, we are called 'to bring this joy to others also, first by promoting justice in the world. It was the dream of God our Father, that with the coming of his son Jesus, his Church, the new Jerusalem, "wrapped in the cloak of justice", would offer the world "the peace of justice" (Bar 5:2,4). So that "all mankind shall see the salvation of God" (Lk3:6). Hence, it is the sacred duty of every Christian "to promote the gospel" in such a way that the entire world "may be found rich in the harvest of justice which Christ has ripened in us (Phil 1:11). Are we then doing our part to level-off the sharp peaks of greed and mountain-sized injustice in the world; and to fill in the low, cold areas of depression and despair, that millions suffer in the dark valleys of the gap between the rich and the poor?

It is true that Advent has joyous strains, but it also calls us to struggle in straightening up our lives, using those sources of help that are available. There is help through the sacraments, with an emphasis on reconciliation; there is help through prayer in which we seek sincerely the Lord; and there is help through Jesus' people around us through whom

God speaks. Thus, the rough ways, the twisted roads and the steep paths are negotiable for he is coming.
