Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Readings: Malachi 3:1-4; Ps. 23; Hebrews 2:14-18; Lk 2: 22-40

Time for Purification

The feast of presentation of the Lord encourages us to recognise Jesus as the light of salvation and to open our hearts to his transformative presence. The coming of the Lord to the temple is to purify and refine us. It comes to cleanse us and renew us. Jesus is brought to the temple as the light of the world.

Prophet Malachi reminds us that God is always faithful to his promises even when they take time to unfold. The presentation of Jesus signifies that God's salvation is not distant and active in our minds. Today's psalm portrays the entrance of the King of Glory into his dwelling place. Similarly in the gospel Jesus is the King of Glory who is welcomed into the temple. Simeon filled with the Holy Spirit recognises Jesus as the light of revelation to the gentiles and the glory of Israel. His song the "Nunc Dimittis" is the profound declaration of God's salvation.

The second reading from Hebrews, Paul highlights Jesus' role as our High Priest who became like us in all things except sin. By sharing in our humanity he destroyed the power of death and brought redemption. The presentation in the temple prefigures His ultimate sacrifice on the cross where he offers Himself completely for our salvation.

In todays Gospel, we witness Mary and Joseph fulfilling the law by presenting their child Jesus in the temple. Simeon and Anna recognise Him as the promised Saviour. Their joyful recognition emphasizes that in Jesus God comes to us in humility and profound in His love. Simeon's recognition challenges us to ask; Do we see Christ as the light of our lives? Are we open to encounter him in our ordinary moments of our daily existence as Simeon and Anna did in the temple?

As pilgrims of hope let us give hope to the world as this feast brings renewal especially where there is darkness or no sign of hope. Jesus became human to redeem humanity, thus giving us hope and challenging us to give hope to humanity by lighting the candles in our faith. The physical candles remind us that Christ must be lit in us to the world that long for hope. The symbol of offering two doves shows the humility of the family of Jesus into which he is born.

Therefore, simple life reminds us that God's greatest gifts are often found in the humblest places. Simeon's prophesy to Mary "a sword will pierce your soul" points to the future suffering as she witnessed her son's rejection and crucifixion. Yet through his pain the hearts of many will be revealed and salvation will come to all who believe like Anna and Simeon.

Let us dedicate our lives for prayer and worship with devotion and patience waiting for God's redemption to save us. Let us be committed to God's will and be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit role and learn to endure through challenges.
