Readings: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29; Ps.67; Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23; Jn.14:23-29

#### **Living Faith Stories**

This is a collection of testimonies put together by the Catholic Missionary Society. It tells of the faith journeys of ten very different individuals, five men and five women. As adults, each of them has found God in a new way through the Catholic Church. Some already had a Christian background; others had experience of other religions; others still had no faith tradition at all. In a similar way, their personal lives were also very diverse. Certainly, choosing to become a Catholic has made change and leaving some things behind. For one of them discovering the love of God made real in Jesus was a turning point from a life of violence and crime as a modern-day gangster in the East End of London. Another, began accompanying her Catholic husband to Mass simply to please him and be part of something that was her a "sense of belong."

These ten faith stories are impressive, but they are only a small sample of the many people, throughout the Church worldwide, who have found and continue to find an adult Catholic faith in Jesus. For all of us though, whether we have been Catholics for the whole of our lives or for part of it, we need to keep growing in our faith. Our understanding has to continue to develop; our prayer and sacramental life has to deepen. An adult faith cannot be stagnant. It means living and growing in appreciation of the mysteries of God's kingdom and experiencing more closely the new kind of life Jesus offers.

The scriptures given to us for today's eucharist all carry with them a real sense of growth and development in the understanding of faith. In the Acts of the Apostles, we see the early Church coming to grips with questions surrounding non-Jewish people becoming Christians, those known as Gentiles. Some Jewish converts to Christianity had kept certain Jewish traditions, most notably that of circumcision as the sign of God's Covenant with the Israelites. This Covenant was renewed and fulfilled in Christ's death and resurrection, the New Covenant of his body and his blood. Jesus himself referred to his own body as the new temple, as the Lamb of God, we encounter through our relationship with him.

The first Christians grew in appreciation of the New Covenant, the new relationship established by Christ. God's presence was no longer confined to an early temple, but accessible to anyone with faith in Jesus, the Lamb of God. Finally, Jesus, present in the flesh, prepared the disciples for his presence with them, through the Spirit, until his return in glory.

Approaching the Christian faith as an adult can be challenging. It means thinking seriously, reflecting deeply, and praying sincerely. It involves constantly growing to understand Jesus and the Church in a fresh light.

This has happened throughout history, from the time of the first disciples, and it needs to happen today in our hearts and minds. Our faith journey of conversion is a life-long process of Christian maturity. In it we are never alone. We journey as members of the body of Christ, supported and inspired by the Spirit of the living God.
