## The Most Holy Trinity Sunday Year C

**Readings:** Proverbs 8:22-31; Ps.8; Romans 5:1-5; Jn.16:12-15

### Remembrance Day!

The shock and horror of the great war led many people to renounce religion and to lose faith in God. But we remember it every year. The skills of modern science lead many more to reduce religion and God to the realms of fantasy. Some feel that we do not need religion. God is only a distraction.

St Paul was a man who moved from scepticism about Christ to a deep Christian faith. Born and brought up in the faith of Israel, a bitter opponent of Christ until he met him personally on the road to Damascus, Paul travelled to many places and encountered many cultures. He met all kinds of faith and no faith. He saw the cruelties of the world and experienced his own fair share of them. But it was that meeting with the Lord that changed his life and rooted him forever in Jesus Christ.

The gift of grace, this faith, gave to St Paul his inner drive and peace with God. Now, he has become dynamic preacher of God's love. What a change! Paul is fired by faith, hope and love. These gifts of grace enable Paul to stand firm in the face of his foes, to look forward with bright hope to the heavenly promises, and to practise genuine love of people whether he meets them. This is the witness that wins people to the God of Jesus Christ, to the Father of us all. The beauty of the world may lead people to think of a creator, but it is the flesh and blood witness of people, alive with a genuine faith, hope, and love, that moves others to seek the Lord. This witness is found in the most genuine form in human suffering.

Paul tells us that we can boast, not only about our hope of heaven, but also about our sufferings. Borne bravely, these sufferings bring us patience, perseverance and a hope that does not fail. The proof is to be seen in the love that inspires people's lives. Love is the most impressive thing of all.

When Jesus was speaking with his friends at the Last Supper, he spoke about the future and said that many things would be made plain in time to come. The Holy Spirit, a spirit of truth, would reveal many things to us and help us to understand. Our journey through life is also a journey into understanding. Paul's own grasp of things developed as he pursued his missionary journeys. In his letters you can see him developing his grasp of heavenly teachings. One of those great teachings is "the hope of heaven."

Paul tells us that we do not know what heaven will be. But what we do know is that we shall be like Christ himself, because we shall see him as he really is. Gazing on Christ will make us like him. Yes, faith is the foundation of our hope, and hope inspires our love. Thanks be to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
